There are options available at VETA (Vocational Education Training Authority) in Moshi.

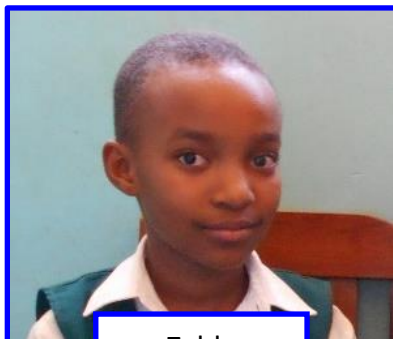
