make dreams come true.

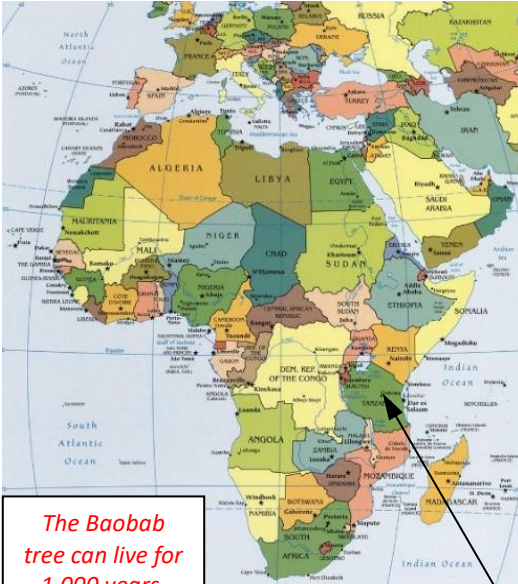

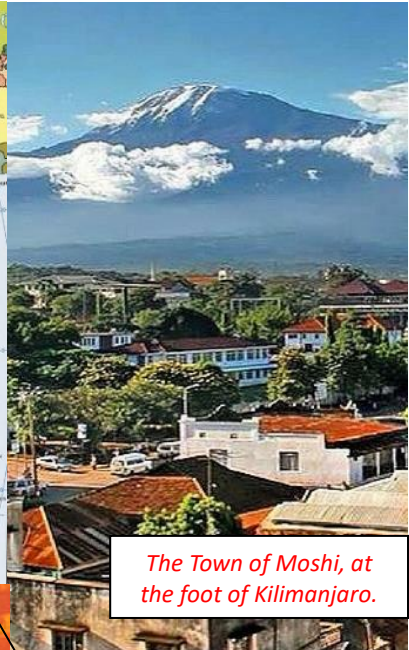




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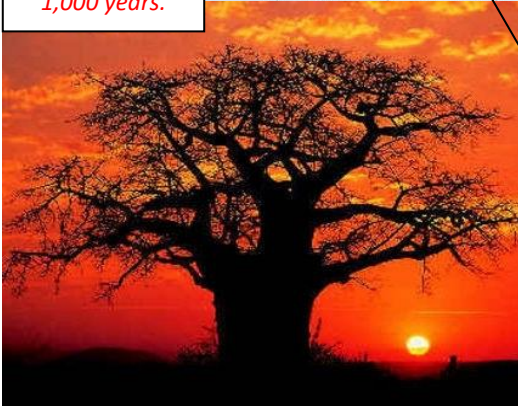


The Baobab tree can live for 1,000 years.
